The Art of Medicine

"Doctors all read the same books," he says. "But the art of medicine is the trust we build with patients and how we deliver that care."

That philosophy shapes everything he does. Whether he's speaking with a patient, collaborating with a nurse or

aligning with fellow physicians, he adapts his communication with intention and empathy. He sees leadership not just as oversight, but as connection—meeting people where they are and building trust from there.

Relationships That Go Beyond Care

Nephrology is unique among medical specialties. Dialysis patients are seen not just occasionally, but often weekly and for an indefinite period of time. Over time, those interactions evolve into something deeper. "Think about it. Nephrology is the singular practice where you get to see your patients weekly. Ours is not a superficial relationship," Dr. Khurana explains.

He speaks about patients who know his children, who follow their milestones, who celebrate their successes alongside him. In return, he knows their stories, their challenges and their lives beyond treatment.

It's a level of connection that is both rare and powerful, and one that fuels his commitment to the field.

A Universal Standard of Care

Dr. Khurana's experience spans diverse patient populations, including those in correctional healthcare. But his philosophy remains unwavering.

"I don't see different patient groups. They're all human beings."

He is intentional about removing bias from care environments, ensuring that every patient is treated with dignity, respect and compassion. For him, the role of healthcare is clear: "Mine is to provide the best possible care without judgment."

That mindset is foundational to how he leads and how he expects teams to operate.

The Role of a Modern CMO

As Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Khurana sees his role in a distinctive way.

"My job isn't to advocate for the business," he says. "It's to be the glue that brings the business and the medicine together."

That perspective is central to Rendevor's vision. By aligning clinical excellence with operational strength, he aims to ensure that patient care remains the driving force behind every decision.

"Good patient care leads to good outcomes. It leads to happy patients. It leads to good business. It's a win for everyone."
